### TAKING THE AUDIO TOUR

There are six stops arranged in a one mile loop. If you listen to all five storytellers at each tour stop you'll spend about 20 minutes in each location. It takes about 5 minutes to walk from one tour stop to the next. The full audio tour takes about 2.5 hours. If you follow just one storyteller around the loop, the tour takes 45 minutes. There are places to sit at each tour stop and signs to guide you along the way.

- 1. To begin, select and listen to the Audio Tour Introduction.
- 2. Next, walk to the first stop on the tour and select *Stop 1 Overlook* on your audio device. If you want to hear all the stories, just press the track labeled "Introduction" and they will play in a series. If you want to hear one particular storyteller, press the track with their title, for example, "Farmer" or "Tribal Leader".
- 3. Stay on the trails and take off your headphones as you walk from one tour stop to another.


